## Holy Week

### *Scavenger Hunt*

#### **Best Use & Nutritional Value**

- Family activity to recount the events of Holy Week

#### **Advance Preparation**

- Most of the items should be found in every home (inside and outside)
- Have a Bible or Bible app ready

#### **During The Scavenger Hunt**

- Some of the scavenger hunt items will already be listed and others will have to be found by looking up the Bible verse. (Hint: answers are given after the verses)
- Either physically collect each item or take pictures of a family member showing with each item
- Go back through the items at the end and recount the events of Holy Week
- Reflect on what Jesus did for us during Holy Week and at the end give thanks to God in prayer for his plan of salvation (John 3:16; Romans 5:8)

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### Holy Week Scavenger Hunt

Each item is either plainly listed or is the blank in the Bible verse.

- Luke 19:36-39**— “And Jesus went along, people spread their \_\_\_\_\_ on the road... the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: ‘Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!’ **Cloaks/Jackets**
- Mark 14:18** – While they were reclining at the \_\_\_\_\_ eating, he said, “Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me — one who is eating with me.” **Table**
- Matthew 26:6**— “While Jesus was in Bethany in the home of Simon the Lep-er, a woman came to him with an alabaster jar of very expensive \_\_\_\_\_, which she poured on his head as he was reclining at the table.” **Perfume**
- Matthew 26:23** – Jesus replied, “The one who has dipped his hand into the \_\_\_\_\_ with me will betray me. **Bowl**
- Matthew 27:3** – When Judas, who had betrayed him, saw that Jesus was con-demned, he was seized with remorse and returned the thirty pieces of \_\_\_\_\_ to the chief priests and the elders. **Silver**
- Mark 14: 22**— “While they were eating, Jesus took \_\_\_\_\_, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, “Take it; this is my body.” **Bread**
- Luke 22:35** – Then Jesus asked them, “When I sent you without purse, \_\_\_\_\_ or sandals, did you lack anything?” “Nothing,” they answered. **Bag**
- Mark 14:36** – “Abba, Father,” he said, “everything is possible for you. Take this \_\_\_\_\_ from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will.” **Cup**
- John 19:29** – A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a \_\_\_\_\_ in it, put the \_\_\_\_\_ on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus’ lips. **Sponge**
- Matthew 27:42** – “He saved others,” they said, “but he can’t save himself! He’s the king of Israel! Let him come down now from the \_\_\_\_\_, and we will believe in him. **Cross**
- Matthew 27:59** – Joseph took the body, wrapped it in a clean linen \_\_\_\_\_ **Cloth**
- John 19:34** – Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus’ side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and \_\_\_\_\_. **Water**
- John 20:1** – Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the \_\_\_\_\_ had been re-moved from the entrance. **Stone**

#### **Bonus**

- Something Black**—Represents Sin (**Romans 3:23**)
- Something Red**— Represents the Blood of Jesus (**Romans 5:8**)
- Something White**— Represents Forgiveness (**Isaiah 1:18; 1 John 1:9**)

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
