The stage is set. The curtain is about to rise. The drama is about to begin. It's the greatest story the world has ever heard. And you and I are invited to become players in this divine drama called the Gospel Story. Its first act is called, "Advent." Advent begins the Christian year, as we spend the four weeks leading up to Christmas in holy anticipation of the coming of the Messiah, the Promised Ruler who is Ancient and Strong.

In Advent we join with the ancient longing, hungering for God to move among His people and bring redemption, deliverance, and restoration. Sarah and Abraham longed for a son. The Hebrew slaves longed for a Promised Land. The Jews in Babylonian exile yearned to return home. Oppressed Jews looked for a Heavenly King to overthrow the Empire. And we too long for our Lord and Savior to come quickly and usher in God's eternal rule and reign on the Earth.

This year's Advent theme is "A Season of Longing." We will explore our longing, and our world's longing, for the hope, peace, joy, and love that can come only from the Savior born in Bethlehem, who in Jerusalem would then die and rise and ascend to the Father, and who comes to every person who calls upon His name as Lord and Savior. We prepare for His return and open our hearts more to His rule and reign in us as we reflect on His first coming 2,000 ago.

I pray that you will make the most of this "season of longing" by making use of our annual **Advent Devotional**, which is a little different this year. We were graciously given the right to reprint devotionals written by John Piper. *We will return to having members of FBC write devotionals next year*. But this year gives us a different experience and a unique opportunity to reflect on the depths of God's grace as we welcome the Christ into our Advent season, just as the Shepherds welcomed him into this world. There are lots of fun **family activities** for parents and grandparents to use in helping our children experience Advent and Christmas with a focus on Jesus.

Join us in worship each week of Advent, beginning with our annual **Hanging of the Green** service on December 3. Worship with us on **Christmas Eve** with a normal morning of Sunday School and worship, then join us at 5 PM for the candlelight Lord's Supper service. Remember our **Week of Prayer for International Missions**, from December 10-17. May I encourage you to go ahead and decide how much God would have you give to the **Lottie Moon Christmas Offering**...our church's goal is \$13,000. Every penny goes directly to the field to help Southern Baptists carry the Gospel to the nations.

There are also several ways you and your family can serve and share Jesus with our community this month, such as the **Drive-Thru Nativity** December 3, 4, and 5; contributing to the **Angel Tree** gifts for foster care children, and the "Wrap Party" at 2 PM on the 10th to prepare those gifts to be distributed; bringing your kids or grand-kids to go **Christmas Caroling** to our nursing homes and shut-ins at the 17th—followed by hot chocolate around a fire in our park!

And I hope you can join us for some wonderful times of fellowship, learning, and worshipping this month. For example, our Women's Ministry is presenting a unique Advent program for women called **"Prepare Him Room,"** with a simulcast session in the Sanctuary and Christmas appetizers in the Atrium. Ladies, make plans to be there on Saturday the 16th, from 4-6:30 PM. Also, everyone is invited to our annual Christmas Family Feast at 6 PM on Wednesday the 13th. Please note that time, as the meal and fellowship will be the program—and maybe a fun game!

Word of Praise!!! I want to end with an exciting announcement: We have exceeded our church goal of 300 Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes!!! Thank you to everyone who brought boxes in July and November. Each box represents a child and a family who will learn about the love of the Savior born on Christmas Day!

Drive-Thru Nativity, Sunday—Tuesday, 12/3-5

This is the schedule we used last year, and it did what we wanted — more people could help us set everything up on Sunday afternoon. We need your help again!

• Sunday afternoon, December 3, after lunch: help us set up our props! You don't have to do the "final touches"; we're just needed to put everything in place (the first day is the hardest).

And then here's the daily schedule:

- 5:00 the supper line opens
- ~6:00 we want our actors to start getting into costume, our parking lot attendants to start directing traffic, and our tech team to live-test the lights and narration
- $\sim 6:30$ we want our actors to move into position
- \sim 6:45 we want to let traffic flow to the Nativity entrance and then release them to our Census Taker as soon as possible.

Remember that this is our "Christmas gospel presentation" to our community. We do this once a year, and we can be patient and encouraging of one another as we give our guests the best Nativity experience they could possibly have.

- Sunday, Dec 17—the kids are going caroling to our care facilities, and we think the adults should do some caroling, too! As we flesh out this plan, we will let the Sunday School classes know more.
- Sunday, Dec 24—normal Sunday morning (i.e., Sunday School and worship at normal times). And don't forget our Christmas Eve service at 5:00 PM!
- Sunday, Dec 31—normal Sunday morning.

DFCS does important, but very difficult work in caring for these children coming out of challenging circumstances.

I know it can be a challenge to find time during the busyness of the season, but I encourage you to find 10 -15 minutes as a family to go through the devotion together and talk about it.
