I'm so thankful for the gym and its A/C, for those who work to set it up and get materials and equipment moved, and for the way it forces us to be creative about things like Lord's Supper and Baptism. And it will make it that much easier to set up in the gym for Worship on July 3rd—because, "thanks be to God!" we have our new organ (and it is fully paid-for!!!) and finally, a year later, we are refinishing the floor in the pulpit and choir loft! But that's May and July...I'm here to talk about June.

Let me start off the summer by officially welcoming to our staff Laura Wall as our Director of Preschool Ministries. She has been a teacher in our preschool for several years (and a preschool parent) and brings excitement and ideas for how to serve families, teach students, and grow the program. She begins this month to prepare the Cornerstone Preschool for another fantastic year of educating minds, shaping hearts, and engaging families on our church campus. Pray for the upcoming year, the teachers, and for the children we hope to reach. But we have other exciting things this month—Father's Day is our VBS kick-off day. I hope you'll not only bring the kids and grandkids to begin our VBS week, but that you'll come with dad, granddad, uncle, brother, and friend to celebrate the men in our lives and our church.

While the youth and children have a wide variety of fun and creative Wednesday night events, I'm so excited to share Season 2 of The Chosen, the worldwide phenomenon of a TV series about the life of Jesus and His disciples. It is the first multi-season TV series on the life of Jesus and the largest crowd-funded project in history! There is no Hollywood involvement, and the show is written, directed, and produced by evangelical Christians with a heart for sharing the Gospel and a desire to be biblically faithful, even as they must take some artistic license to help tell the story of Jesus in a creative way on the screen. We will watch the episodes together in the Fellowship Hall at 6 PM and then spend the rest of the hour discussing it. Of course, you can also watch both seasons FREE through The Chosen App or online at www.thechosen.tv. But even if you do, I hope you'll still join us on Wednesdays to re-watch and discuss! It's also a great way to introduce a friend to the story of Christ and the Gospel.

Finally, I want to return to May and July one more time. Last week, at the Thomson City Council meeting, the council approved the transfer of Borders Street and the portion of Church Street bounded by our property to First Baptist Thomson. We are finishing up the legal details, but I'm so thankful for the dedication and hard work of those who for the past 18 months kept this idea alive. We look forward to creative uses of these roadways for ministry and for increasing the safety of everyone on our campus.

And remember that in the July Quarterly Church Conference, we will vote on the proposed amendment to the church's constitution to update the Beliefs and Values statement to reflect the church's vision adopted in 2019 and the Baptist Faith and Message as adopted by the SBC in 2001 and the Georgia Baptist Mission Board in 2021.

I look forward to seeing you this summer in worship, involved in ministry, and fellowshipping together! I'm beyond thankful to be your pastor!
