FBC Women's Conference

One of our church's missional marks that help us assess how we are thinking, being, and acting like Jesus is Cooperation. This is an important word for Baptists. We have even named our mechanism for pooling financial resources for the work of missions and ministry the Cooperative Program. The idea is that we can do much more together than we can separately. This month I want to share a few thoughts and updates about our cooperation with fellow Baptist churches on the local, state, and national level.

The Kilpatrick Baptist Association: The KBA was formed 108 years ago here at First Baptist church as a way for local Baptist churches to coordinate our Great Commission efforts. Today the KBA is made up of 33 Baptist churches in five counties: McDuffie, Warren, Columbia, Glascock, and Jefferson. Our Associational Mission Strategist, Rev. Tim Bachelor, leads our association in missions, strengthening our churches, and encouraging and equipping pastors. I want to encourage you to attend this year's KBA Annual Meeting on October 25 from 6-8:30 PM at FBC Warrenton. You will learn more about our association and how to be a part of upcoming mission trips, disaster relief ministries, and more. You'll also learn where some of your tithe and Go and Tell offerings go.

The Georgia Baptist Mission Board: Our church has recently seen the GBMB in action with our One Day Fun Day which is funded by the Mission: Georgia Offering, and the "No Sweat" Evangelism Training with Brad Marchman. The GBMB exists to help Baptist churches across Georgia partner together for missions and ministry. The three priorities for the GBMB are: "Pastors are our heroes, Churches are our priority, Georgia is our mission field." I have the privilege of serving on the Executive Committee for the GBMB and get to see the inner workings of our state mission board. We are led by godly men and women who love Jesus and His churches and want to reach the lost. The 60% of our Cooperative Program (CP) giving is put to good use in our state. Through our Go and Tell Fund, we support the GA Baptist Children's Home and Disaster Relief efforts every month, in addition to the annual Mission: Georgia Offering and our regular CP giving. I want to encourage you to make plans to join me at Warren Baptist Church in Augusta November 13-15 for the 200th Anniversary of the GBMB! You'll be inspired by great preaching, moved by powerful worship, learn more about our mission board, see IMB missionaries commissioned, and celebrate what God has done these past 200 years through Georgia Baptists!

The Southern Baptist Convention: On a national level, our church freely associates with and gives to support the work of Southern Baptists to reach our neighbors and the nations with the Gospel. 40% of our CP gifts help keep missionaries in North America and around the world on the field, fund our 6 seminaries, and fund the Ethics and Religious Liberty Commission. Some of you have wondered how the recent investigation into the SBC by the US Department of Justice affects us. In short, we are an autonomous local church, and are not dictated by any other Southern Baptist Church, nor can we dictate what any other church does or does not do. The DOJ is investigating instances of sexual misconduct in Southern Baptist churches that were ignored by a small number of leaders in the Convention. We can all agree this is shameful and as James said, "these things should not be so." However, because of our polity as autonomous local churches loosely affiliated for cooperative missions, I don't believe that the DOJ's investigation really affects us. The SBC Executive Committee has already conducted their own investigation into these matters with an outside firm, made their report this past June, and made resolutions to clarify our stance on biblical sexual ethics, supporting those who have suffered any form of abuse, and reprimanding those who stand in the way of justice. I will say more about this at our Quarterly Church Conference October 16 and answer any questions you have. God is doing good work through Southern Baptists. Let us continue to pray for, give to, and be involved in the work of Baptists locally, in our state, and in our nation.

Let's Emphasize the Go and Tell Mission Fund This October

At FBC, instead of taking up offerings for the different ministries important to our church, we focus on one: **The Go and Tell Mission Fund**. We have identified seven critical ministries: Manna, our local Kilpatrick Baptist Association, the Georgia Baptist Children's Home, World Hunger, Georgia Baptist Disaster Relief, HOI, and Smoky Mountain Resort Ministries. Each of them receive a percentage of everything we receive to that fund. We have also set aside 1/3 of the fund for "FBC Missions". This can include supplying emergency needs (like Ukraine, or the Kentucky floods), but it is designed for local mission work by church members. Does your Sunday School class have a mission idea but need help funding it? That's what this is for. Please consider giving \$5/week to the Go and Tell Mission Fund.
