For All Generations: April was a month of worship and celebration! Palm Sunday was an incredible day of celebration and vision as we gathered for our Reveal Sunday and praised God for how He has moved through our For All Generations campaign. We announced our commitments and first fruit offerings as of that day. Praise God, many more have added to both of those numbers since then! As of this writing, our commitments total \$1,413,160 and first fruits offerings and gifts to date are \$202,456! Thanks be to God for His ongoing faithfulness and your continued generosity! The next Sunday we celebrated the Resurrection of Jesus—our Risen Lord who gives us faith in the place of fear, joy in the midst of sorrow, and a reason to worship even in seasons of doubt. It was a powerful reminder that our hope is not in buildings or budgets, but in the living Savior who is building His Church!

As of this writing, our **Quarterly Church Conference** on April 27th is ahead of us, which will include an important next step. The Campus Renewal Team will bring a proposal to authorize the development of engineered drawings and cost estimates for the renovations outlined in our campaign. These professional plans will help us align the vision with the commitments that have been made, enabling us to develop a wise and phased approach for completing the work. Once we have the drawings and estimates in hand, we will bring a full proposal to the church for approval before any construction begins. This is an exciting time of planning and preparation, and we continue to ask for your prayers as we seek to be faithful stewards of all God is entrusting to us.

May brings several more opportunities for worship and service, beginning with the **National Day of Prayer Breakfast** on May 1 at Thomson Presbyterian Church at 6:45 AM. I hope you can join me as we gather with our fellow believers around town to give God thanks for His blessings on our nation and pray for His continued guidance and protection. The next night we gather with our community for **Relay for Life** at the Thomson High School track beginning at 6 PM. I hope you'll come to walk the track, eat dinner with the FBC team, and enjoy ice cream and fellowship. I'm thankful for Debbie Petrie answering the call to be our team leader.

We have some exciting worship opportunities on Sundays this month. I'll be preaching sermons throughout the summer reminding us of our church's core values, which we adopted in 2019. I'm entitling this series: *From the Inside Out: Becoming Who God Calls Us to Be.* I hope that every Sunday you're in town this summer, you'll continue to prioritize Sunday School and worship with your church family.

On May 11th, we recognize and honor mothers, grandmothers, and the women in our lives who have shaped and influenced us. I'll bring a special message that day in honor of **Mother's Day**. This year in honor of our moms, we are donating to the Go and Tell Fund, part of which supports the Georgia Baptist Children's Home. With increasing costs for some of the gifts we've given in the past, the pastors thought this was far more meaningful and lasting use of our funds.
