Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

As we wrap up 2023, let's celebrate a wonderful year of worship, fellowship, ministry, and missions. We baptized 14 people and saw another 16 join our church, for 30 new members, adding several new families. We exceeded all our offering goals for this past year—praying we do the same for Lottie Moon—and took in more Operation Christmas Child boxes than we have in several years. We saw a record year of gifts to the Go and Tell Fund, had a great Drive-Thru Nativity, and celebrated Matt Ward's 10 years as our associate pastor. I'm so thankful for this church and to serve as your pastor!

Remember that we will have a normal Sunday morning on **Christmas Eve**, with Sunday School and worship. I hope you'll join us for the Candlelight Lord's Supper service that night at 5 PM. Also remember **Year End Gifts** need to be in the church office by Friday the 29th, given on Sunday the 31st, or at least postmarked by the 31st to count toward your 2023 giving record. We really appreciate all the extra year-end gifts that allow us to give extra to the Cooperative Program and our future emergency needs. And don't forget Lottie Moon and Capital Improvements!

Now, on to 2024: I'm excited for some new ministry opportunities this new year, such as a Wild Game Supper and a Marriage Retreat in the Spring, the West Virginia mission trip in July, and missions and ministry fair in the Fall. Be in prayer for these and all our regular events, projects, and trips.

Our focus for 2024 is "Foundations," especially foundations of our faith, foundations for healthy families, and foundations for a thriving church family. We will focus on some basic beliefs and truths that shape our lives, and the basic disciplines and practices we need to live those beliefs out in the day-to-day. You'll see these themes play out in events like the Marriage Retreat, in resources like the Faith@Home Center, in sermon series, and in some renewed efforts to help our church love one another better, serve the needy, and reach the lost.

To kick off this theme, I'll be preaching a sermon series on Genesis 1-3, called "Origins." Over the next couple of months, we'll discover what these foundational chapters of the Bible teach us about God, ourselves, our world, marriage and family, how things have gone so terribly wrong, and how God is working to put all things right again. I look forward to seeing you in your pew every Sunday!!!

Also, make sure to join us again on Wednesdays beginning January 10, especially as we pick back up on our "Route 66" Road Trip thru the Bible, with the book of Ezra.

Finally, I am thrilled that our **Campus Vision Team** (part of the strategic revitalization efforts we began in 2019) is ready to present their final report, a **campus master plan** for best stewardship and use of the amazing facilities God has blessed us with. They will make this report and reveal this master plan at the **Quarterly Church Conference** at 6 PM on January 21. You do not want to miss this reveal! There have been so many upsetting headlines. I read about a small Baptist church in Missouri that got utterly trashed by vandals (with no known motive). The week before, we heard about the churches in Tennessee that were damaged by the tornadoes. There has been a steady increase in violence against Christians in many parts of the world (such as Africa and East Asia). (And don't forget about the recent experiences of Jews in our country.) We long for peace, and yet peace seems further and further away every year.

But here's an amazing thing about all of those Christians I just mentioned — they gathered for worship the following Sunday. The damaged churches cleaned up what they could and postponed what they had to. But they gathered. Our persecuted brothers and sisters may have to take extraordinary measures to keep their church members safe, but they gather.

They understand that Christmas is about peace — peace with God through Jesus Christ. And nothing will prevent them from enjoying and sharing that peace. I find that to be healthy perspective for us. We may be busy, and tired, and worried, and out-of-sorts. But don't let that distract you from the peace you have with God. And don't let that prevent you from sharing that peace with your church family and your community. Gloria in excelsis Deo!

The total cost of the trip is \$320 for 5 nights with all meals, recreation activities, and lodging included. Rising 7th graders are invited to attend this camp with us! Please have a non-refundable deposit of \$75 turned into the office by the end of January to secure a spot.

The kids will be returning to CentriKid camp this year, but at a different location. This year we are going to Boiling Springs, NC (Gardner Webb University). The kids (and chaperones) all had a wonderful time together last summer. We are looking forward to another wonderful experience at camp! This camp is for rising 2nd graders—rising 6th graders. The deposit for this camp is also \$75 and is due by the end of January.

Upward Basketball practices start the first week of the New Year! We have 20 teams this year and 158 kids registered - Praise God! We are still looking for basketball referees for games. Even if you are not experienced in this role, you can easily learn and help with the younger kids' game. Contact the church office if you can serve in this capacity. 
